**Christian Harrison (USA)**

**AGE: 29**  
**SHREVEPORT, LA, USA**  
**CURRENT DOUBLES RANK: 150**

Harrison overcame a injury-riddled start to career by breaking into Top 200 and achieving career-high No. 198 in 2018. He qualified for only the second time at the 2022 Wimbledon Championships and his third Major main draw and won his first match at any Major, defeating wildcard Jay Clarke.



**Shunsuke Mitsui (JPN)**

**AGE: 21**  
**SHIZOUKA, JAPAN**  
**CURRENT DOUBLES RANK: 458**

Mitsui was ranked as high at #6 in the college doubles rankings. He posted two singles victories in his fall debut at the Big 12/SEC Challenge.



**Mikelis Libietis (LAT)**

**AGE: 31**  
**SIGULDA, LATVIA**  
**CURRENT DOUBLES RANK: 151**

Libietis was the top-ranked collegiate player in both singles and doubles when he played for the Vols. He teamed with Hunter Reese to win the 2014 NCAA Doubles Championship and they followed that by winning the 2014 Knoxville Challenger Doubles Title.

**Filip Pieczonka (POL)**

**AGE: 19**

Pieczonka earned a 2-1 singles record in his collegiate debut at the Wake Forest Invitational. He also won his first doubles match with fellow freshman Filip Apltauer 6-4, against Suresh and Nathan of Wake Forest.

**Aleksander Kovacevic (USA)**

**CURRENT DOUBLES RANK: 555**

Kovacevic was a 2-time All-American at the University of Illinois and he holds three Challenger singles titles this year.



**Tennys Sandgren (USA)**

**AGE: 32**  
**GALLATIN, TN, USA**  
**CURRENT DOUBLES RANK: 371**

Sandgren held a career high ranking of #41 in singles in 2019. The Gallatin, TN native and former UT Vol is looking to regain his earlier form when he reached the Quarterfinal of the 2018 and 2020 Australian Open.

Smith was a 3-time All-American at UCLA where he won the 2019 NCAA Doubles title with Maxime Cressy.



**Marcus Willis (GBR)**

**AGE: 33**  
**SLOUGH, GREAT BRITAIN**  
**CURRENT DOUBLES RANK: 204**

Willis is a former Knoxville Challenger competitor who made his ATP tour debut by advancing through the 2016 Wimbledon qualifying tournament as a wildcard and reaching the second round of the main draw where he played Roger Federer on Centre Court.
