Michael Mmoh (USA) AGE: 25 BRADENTON, FL, USA CURRENT HIGH RANK: 103

A two-time Champion of the Knoxville Challenger, Mmoh is back in Knoxville after a successful fall that has seen him win Challenger titles in each of the last two months. Earlier this year, Mmoh was the winner of the Roland Garros Wild Card Challenge, a fourweek competition rewarding the player who accumulates the most ATP points with a Wild Card into the US Open. Mmoh has a 152-88 career record on ATP Challenger Tour with all 7 titles on hard courts. Has 135-71 record on hard and 14-12 on clay courts.



Martin Damm (USA) AGE: 20 BRADENTON, FL, USA CURRENT HIGH RANK: 269

Martin Damm reached the doubles final here in Knoxville last year, with Dammand partner Mitchell Krueger losing a tight three-set final. While the 6'8" lefty has continued to have success in doubles in 2023 – reaching the semifinals of challengers in Alicante, Spain, and Charlottesville, Virginia in October – he has also progressed in singles, advancing to the quarterfinals in Alicante and the semifinals in Bratislava, Slovakia last month. As a junior player, Damm captured the U.S. 18-and-under doubles title (with Toby Kodat) in 2019 and the two were the youngest doubles team to win a match at the US Open in the Open era.

Brandon Holt (USA)

AGE: 25

ROLLING HILLS, CA, USA

CURRENT HIGH RANK: 279

Four-time All-American from USC, Brandon Holt has made great strides in 2022 and 2023, having started 2022 ranked just 830th. He's reached the quarterfinals of each of his last two Challengers – Fairfield, California, and Charlottesville, Virginia. In 2022, he qualified for the US Open and defeated Taylor Fritz in the first round of the main draw. This year, he qualified for the Australian Open and lost in a five-set match to then-world #25 Roberto Bautista Agut.



Aleksandar Kovacevic (USA) AGE: 25

NEW YORK, NY, USA

CURRENT HIGH RANK: 112



Two-time All-American during his collegiate career at Illinois, Kovacevic turned pro after he completed his senior season. Kovacevic made his ATP main draw debut at the 2022 Korea Open, where he entered as a lucky loser. He recorded his first ATP tour-level win defeating seventh seed and world No. 32, Miomir Kecmanović, in the first round. Next, he defeated Tseng Chun-hsin to reach his first ATP quarterfinal and Mackenzie McDonald to reach his first ATP semifinal.
